

Division II - Arrangements Rules

Arrangements Score Card (all classes) **Possible 100 points**

Conformance - 15 points a. Naming of roses b. Conformance to type of design c. Other specific requirements of schedule

Design - 30 Points Balance, dominance, contrast, rhythm, proportion, scale

Perfection of the Rose(s) - 30 points Including condition of other plant material

Creativity and Expressiveness - 15 points

Distinction - 10 Points Unique, sets the design apart, superiority in every respect, includes technical execution/construction.

1. All roses must be outdoor garden grown and of high quality.
2. A rose or roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
3. Names of all roses in each arrangement must be written on entry tag.
4. "AG" MUST be written on the entry tag if roses are arranger grown so the entry will be eligible for a medal certificate.
5. One entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class, but an exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired.
6. Accessories are allowed unless stated otherwise in the schedule. Flowers other than roses, and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule.
7. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the arranger's interpretation of the theme or class title, unless the schedule specifically forbids it.
8. An arrangement incorrectly placed in one class when it should have been in another will be judged in the class in which it is placed.
9. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
10. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement. However, in extreme circumstances, if all efforts to locate the arranger have failed, an arrangements chairman may carefully move an arrangement.
11. Space for completing arrangements will be limited.
12. The San Diego Rose Society will not be responsible for exhibits. It is suggested all containers be marked with the name of exhibitor. Your participation is welcomed, and care for your arrangements will be provided to the best of the society's ability. It cannot, however, assume any responsibility for any loss or damage to property.
13. Reservations are required for a guaranteed space. Reservations will close Thursday, June 4, 2009. Please phone Dixie Dahl at 858 453-4908 for reservations. Space permitting, arrangements will be accepted the day of the show without reservations.
14. Arrangements must be in place and ready for judging by 9:30 a.m. on Saturday and remain until the closing of the show at 6:00 p.m. Awards will be presented at 2:15 p.m., Saturday, June 6.
15. Care should be exercised when preparing arrangements in the show area.
16. All water and trash around your area must be cleaned up or disqualification could occur.
17. By entering this show given under ARS rules, exhibitors agree to abide by those rules.

Infringement of the following rules will result in severe penalty.

1. Painted or dyed fresh plant materials and live creatures are not allowed.
2. The use of plant materials on the state or local conservation lists is not permitted.
3. The American flag or flag of any country may not be used in an arrangement or as a decoration in any way.

There are but two causes for disqualification of an arrangement.

1. Roses not outdoor grown.
2. Use of artificial plant material.

Arrangement judging will be done in accordance with ARS guidelines.

Division II Arrangements

Section A - Traditional

All fresh plant material. Correctly named, outdoor-grown roses must provide dominant interest in all arrangements.

Best in Section: ARS Royalty Award and Trophy

Class 3 "Ballet Folklorico" - **Line**

Section B - Judges' Entry

Judges must register at registration table to enter. Open only to arrangement judges of this show. Write design type on entry tag.

ARS Visiting Judges Certificate and award for best in section

Class 4 "Summer Sunset" **Standard Arrangement**

Class 5 "Adobe Roses" **Miniature Arrangement**

Section C - Modern

Best in Section: ARS Artist and Award

Class 6 "Rodeo Days" **Modern**

Class 7 "Mission Bells" **Avante-garde**

Class 8 "Camino Real" **Free Form**

Section D - Oriental Manner

Best in Section: ARS Oriental and Award

Class 9 "Gold Rush" **Low Design**

Class 10 "Green Valley" **Tall Design**

Class 11 "Lakeside" **Freestyle**

Section E - Duchess

Roses with dried and/or treated plant material. No fresh plant material permitted except for roses. Type of design must be noted on entry tag.

Best in Section: ARS Duchess of Arrangements and Award

Class 12 "Oak Hills" Arranger's choice

Class 13 "Ramona" Arranger's choice

Section F - Princess

Roses with rose foliage only. Any part of the rosebush may be used. No other plant materials or accessories permitted.

All materials must be fresh. Note design type on tag.

Best in Section: ARS Princess of Arrangements and Award

Class 14 "Forty-Niner" Arranger's choice

Class 15 "Darling Clementine" Arranger's choice

Section G - Duke

Greater than 10" but not to exceed 20" in height, width or depth. Note design type of design on tag.

Best in Section: ARS Duke of Arrangements and Award

Class 16 "Found Roses" Arranger's choice

Class 17 "Gold Bug Mine" Arranger's choice

Section H - Dried Rose Arrangements

Best in Section: ARS Keepsake Certificate and Award

Using dried roses (correctly named) and/or treated plant material. Note design type on tag.

Class 18 "Hacienda Rose" Arranger's choice

Class 19 "Mexican Fandango" Arranger's choice

Section I - Novice

Best in Section: ARS Novice Certificate and Award

Open only to those who have won no more than 3 first-place arrangement ribbons or a trophy in any ARS show. No design or material restrictions.

Class 20 "Roses on the Trail" - **Standard Arrangement**

Class 21 "Rancho Garden" **Miniature Arrangement**

Section J - Miniature Traditional

Best in Section: ARS Miniature Royalty Certificate and Award

Class 22 "Kumeyaay Song" Traditional design not to exceed 5 inches in height, width or depth.

Class 23 "Around the Ranch" Traditional design greater than 5" but not to exceed 7" in height, width, or depth.

Class 24 "Bear Flag" A traditional design greater than 7" but not to exceed 10" in height, width, or depth

Section L - Miniature Oriental Manner

Not to exceed 10" in height, width, or depth

Best in Section: ARS Miniature Oriental Certificate and Award

Class 25 "Reflection on the Pond" Low Container

Class 26 "Rambling Rose" Tall Container

Section M - Mini-Artist

Best in Section: ARS Miniature Artist Certificate and Award

Class 27 "Wildcat Canyon" A modern arrangement. Not to exceed 5" in height, width, or depth.

Class 28 "Vaquero's Song" Freestyle. An arrangement greater than 5" but not to exceed 10" in height, width, or depth.

Section N - Miniature Dried Rose Arrangement

Using fresh roses with dried and/or treated dried plant material. No fresh plant material other than roses.

Best in Section: ARS Mini-Keepsake Certificate and Award

Class 29 "Padre Roses" Arranger's choice. Not to exceed 5" in height, width, or depth.

Class 30 "Mission Roses" Arranger's choice. *Greater than 5" but not to exceed 10" in height, width, or depth.*

Section O - Table Design

Classes 31 & 32 are eligible for the ARS Court of Etiquette Award.

Class 33 is eligible for the ARS Mini Court of Etiquette Award. All Table Designs are eligible for the ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal Arrangement Certificates if roses are grown by the designer and indicated by "AG" on the entry tag. No Flatware Permitted.

Best in Section: Awards Listed Above

Class 31 "Roses at Sunrise" A functional informal breakfast tray for one. No flatware.

Class 32 "Picnic Under the Pines" An informal picnic lunch for two.

Class 33 "Roses on the Veranda" Using mini roses. A romantic semi-formal exhibit table for two. No flatware.

Directions to Barona Valley Ranch Resort and Casino (30 minutes from downtown San Diego): 1932 Wildcat Canyon Road, Lakeside, CA 92040 888-7-BARONA (722-7662) ~ 619-443-2300.

From San Diego:

1. Take I-8 East (or West) to 67 North.
2. Drive 5 miles on 67 North to the first light; turn right onto Maplevue Street.
3. At the second light on Maplevue, turn left onto Ashwood Street.
4. At the next 4-way stop sign, Ashwood turns into Wildcat Canyon Road. Continue straight on Wildcat Canyon Road.
5. Drive for 5 miles to the main entrance; turn left. The rose show will be held in the Stardome- Big Top Convention area.

Division I Show Rules

- Entry qualifications and times.** Entries will be received from 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. on June 6, 2009. Exhibitors must register at the registration desk. Entrants in Section H must be current members of the SDRS by June 1, 2009. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor in his/her own home garden. All questions about judging rules should be directed to the Chairman of Judges.
- Containers.** All containers will be furnished by the SDRS--only those containers may be used except if noted in the schedule.
- Entry tags.** Only official ARS entry tags may be used. Fill out the upper portion of the tag with the section, class, variety name, and exhibitor's name. No exhibitor number required. Use water resistant blue or black pens. Address labels or rubber stamps are permitted.
- Wedging.** Wedging is permitted, but must allow for water to be added. Wilted exhibits will be removed from exhibition by the show committee. An entry will be penalized if wedging material extends above the top of the vase, according to its degree of distraction.
- Naming of Varieties.** Classification of roses will be in accordance with the latest edition of *Modern Roses Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges, Exhibitors Handbook for Selecting Roses, Combined Rose List*, or the New Rose Registration in the *American Rose*. Roses must be exhibited under the ARS Exhibition names (AEN) as listed in bold type in the *ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses*. ARS publications take priority over *Combined Rose List*. Exception--Class 35: Roses need not be named or registered.
- Placement.** The placement committee will place all roses except for classes 36, 37, 38, 41, 42, 44, 46 and 47. No unauthorized people in the show area.
- Disqualification.** ARS rules governing disqualification will be strictly adhered to including misnamed, misplaced, misclassified, mislabeled or unlabeled, stem-on-stem (except old garden roses and shrubs), side buds, presence of a foreign substance, entries in violation of ARS or show rules, or without an approved exhibition name.
- Entries within Classes.** This is an alphabetically arranged show in all classes. Each variety will constitute a separate class. Duplicate entries of the same variety will result in the disqualification of both entries.
- Awards.** To be given out on Saturday, 2:15 pm in the show hall.
- Entries by Judges.** Horticulture judges may exhibit only in Section L and in the Arrangement Division. Arrangement judges may enter in the Horticulture Division.
- Challenge Classes and Collections.** Each entry is judged using the standards appropriate for the type of rose in the class. 100 possible points/class. Prime elements = 80% of score. Overall appearance = 20% of score.
- Property Rights.** The San Diego Rose Society and Barona Casino shall not be liable for the loss or damage to entries, containers or property. All specimens entered in Division I become the property of the SDRS.

Division I - Horticulture

- Class S Gifts of Love.** Entries in this class will be given to local hospitals and care facilities. Use your own disposable container (*tin can, drink carton, plastic container, etc.*) for a bouquet of leftover roses. Entry may include plant material other than roses. Multiple entries are permitted. Entry time for this class is extended to 10:00 a.m. *Award*

- Class 1 One bloom/stem.** Exhibition form, no side buds.
Queen of Show - *ARS Gold Certificate & Award*
King of Show - *ARS Silver Certificate & Award*
Princess of Show - *ARS Bronze Certificate & Award*
Court of Honor - 4 Runner-ups - *Award*
- Class 2 Three Blooms.** Exhibition form, no sidebuds; one variety, one container. *Award*
- Class 3 Six Blooms.** Exhibition form without sidebuds; one variety, one container. *Award*
- Class 4 One Spray.** Two or more blooms, 1 stem. *ARS Cert & Award*
- Class 5 Fully Open.** Without sidebuds. Stamens visible, no single-petaled varieties. *ARS Certificate & Award*
- Class 6 English Box.** Six of the same or different varieties without foliage. One entry/exhibitor. *ARS Certificate & Award*

Floribundas & Polyanthas

- Class 7 One F Bloom.** Without sidebuds. *ARS Certificate & Award*
- Class 8 Three F Blooms.** One bloom/stem, no sidebuds. One or more varieties in one vase. *ARS Certificate & Award*
- Class 9 One F Spray.** Two or more blooms, one stem.
Queen of Show - *ARS Gold Certificate & Award*
King of Show - *ARS Silver Certificate & Award*
Princess of Show - *ARS Bronze Certificate & Award*
- Class 10 Three F or Poly Sprays.** One or more varieties. One container. *Award*
- Class 11 F English Box.** Six of the same or different varieties, no foliage. One entry/exhibitor. *Award*

Section C

Miniatures and Mini-Floras

Unless noted, exhibitors can enter Mini or Mini-Flora in every class.

- Class 12 One Mini Bloom.** Exhibition form. No sidebuds. No single-petaled varieties.
Mini Queen of Show - *ARS Gold Cert. & Award*
Mini King of Show - *ARS Silver Cert. & Award*
Mini Princess of Show - *ARS Bronze Cert. & Award*
Court of Honor - 4 Runner-ups - *Award*
- Class 13 One Mini-Flora Bloom.** Exhibition form. No sidebuds. No single-petaled varieties.
Mini-Flora Queen of Show - *ARS Gold Cert. & Award*
Mini-Flora King of Show - *ARS Silver Cert. & Award*
Mini-Flora Princess of Show - *ARS Bronze Cert. & Award*
Court of Honor - 4 Runner-ups - *Award*
- Class 14 Three Blooms.** One variety, no sidebuds. Exhibition or decorative form, in one vase. No single-petaled varieties. *Award*
- Class 15 Six Blooms.** One variety, no sidebuds, exhibition form, one vase. *Award*
- Class 16 One Spray.** 2 or more blooms, 1 stem. *Award*
- Class 17 Three Sprays.** One variety, one vase. *Award*
- Class 18 Single-petaled Bloom.** 4-8 petals, no sidebuds. *ARS Certificate & Award*
- Class 19 Fully-Open.** Stamens must show, no single-petaled varieties. *ARS Certificate & Award*
- Class 20 Cycle of Bloom.** One variety of 3 stems: a bud, an exhibition stage bloom, and a fully-opened bloom, shown in one container with variety labeled on entry tag. *ARS Certificate & Award*

Class 21 English Box. Six of the same or different varieties, no foliage. One entry/exhibitor. *ARS Certificate & Award*

Class 22 Artist's Palette. Six different varieties, exhibition form, without foliage. One entry/exhibitor. *Award*

Section D

Shrubs & Large-Flowered Climbers

Class 23 Climber. Large-flowered climbers (Lcl), Hybrid Wichurana (Wich), Hybrid Giganteas (HG). All other roses classified as Cl Ht, Cl OGR, Cl F, Cl Min are to be shown in the hybrid tea, old garden rose, floribunda and miniature classes respectively. *Award*

Class 24 Classic Shrub Rose. One bloom or spray, roses with family designations such as HRg, HMsk, etc. *ARS Certificate and Award*

Class 25 Modern Shrub Bloom. One bloom of those listed as "S" in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses, excluding David Austin shrubs. *ARS Certificate and Award*

Class 26 David Austin Shrub Bloom. One bloom hybridized by David Austin. *Award*

Class 27 Modern Shrub Spray. One spray (two or more blooms) of those listed as "S" in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses. *Award*

Class 28 Shrub Collection of Three. Three stems; bloom or spray classified as "S" in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses, each a different variety. Exhibited in one container with one entry tag listing each variety. *Award*

Section E

Old Garden Roses

Class 29 Genesis. One bloom or spray of any type of old garden rose designated as species (Sp) in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses. *ARS Certificate and award*

Class 30 Dowager. Any rose in existence prior to 1867, one bloom or spray. Date of introduction must be on entry tag. *ARS Certificate and award*

Class 31 Victorian. Any rose, one bloom or spray, introduced in or after 1867. Date of introduction must be on entry tag. *ARS Certificate and Award*

Section F

Novice

A novice is one who has not won a trophy or ARS certificate in a past ARS show. A novice exhibitor is not restricted to the novice class. Each entry consists of one stem. Exhibitor may make multiple entries of different varieties. Winners in both classes will be considered for royalty. *ARS Certificate and award in each class.*

Class 32 Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda. Any bloom or spray.

Class 33 Miniature or Mini-flora. Any bloom or spray.

Section G

Miscellaneous

Class 34 Large Flowered Single-Petaled Spray. One spray of a single-petaled rose (4-8 petals) including hybrid tea, floribunda, and old garden rose. *Award*

Class 35 Seedling Rose. One stem of any type bred by, grown as a chance seedling by or found as a sport by the exhibitor. *Award*

Class 36 6-Inch Floating Bowl. One hybrid tea, grandiflora or floribunda rose, no foliage. Rose must be floating. Exhibitor may place exhibit. *ARS Certificate & Award*

Class 37 4-Inch Floating Bowl. Three mini or mini-flora roses no foliage. Roses must be floating. Exhibitor may place exhibit. One entry per exhibitor. *Award*

Class 38 Bouquet Bowl. Five or more blooms of any type, no foliage, floating in 8-inch bowl. One entry tag, all varieties named. Exhibitor may place exhibit. One entry per exhibitor. Judged 60% on bloom quality and 40% color, balance and overall effect. *Award*

Class 39 Most Fragrant HT Gr, or F. One stem, no sidebuds. Judged 70% on fragrance, 30% on horticulture excellence of bloom. *ARS Certificate & Award*

Class 40 Most Fragrant Shrub. One stem, no sidebuds. Judged 70% on fragrance, 30% on horticulture excellence of bloom. *ARS Certificate & Award*

Class 41 Big and Little Look-alikes. 1 large bloom (any type) and 1 mini or mini-flora bloom, shown in separate vases each with a separate tag. Roses should look alike except for size. Exhibitor may place exhibit. *ARS Cert. & Award*

Class 42 Matched Pair. Two stems, one variety, exhibited in separate vases each with a separate tag. Exhibitor may place the exhibit. *Award*

Class 43 Cycle of Bloom. One variety of HT or Gf. One bud, one exhibition stage, and one fully open bloom, shown in one container. *Award*

Class 44 Picture Frame. One bloom, any type displayed in 8" frame provided by SDRS. Rose foliage permitted. Exhibitor may place. 1 entry/exhibitor. *Award*

Class 45 Au Naturel. 1 stem or spray, any variety grown without any spraying in the last year. Limit 3 entries per exhibitor. *Award*

Section H

SDRS Challenge Classes

Open only to SDRS members as of June 1, 2009.

Class 46 The Joseph J. and Jean Kenneally Bowl. One hybrid tea or hybrid perpetual of the highest type of exhibition quality. One entry/exhibitor. (*Exhibition form: one half to three quarters open, gracefully shaped with sufficient petals symmetrically arranged in an attractive circular outline, tending toward a high center.*) Established in 1963 and now honoring the San Diego couple who set modern standards for ARS convention organization and rose show competition. *SDRS Certificate & Award*

Class 47 The Ruth Faber Trophy. Bowl, 10" diameter, furnished by exhibitor. All types of roses, staged for all round effect. Rose foliage and hips allowed. Roses need not be named. Oasis may be used. One entry/exhibitor. *Judged on bloom quality, foliage and overall effect. Award*

Section I

Intermediate

Open only to exhibitors who have never won a "Queen of Show" award in an ARS-accredited show. Intermediate exhibitors may enter any other classes except Novice. Winners in both classes will be considered for royalty. Award in each class.

Class 48 Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda. Bloom or spray.

Class 49 Mini or Mini-Flora. Bloom or spray.

Section L

Judges

Eligible only to judges who are judging this show. No more than one entry of a variety per class from each judge. ARS Certificate for each class.

Class 50 One Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora bloom.

Class 51 One Floribunda spray.

Class 52 One Miniature or Mini-flora bloom or spray.

Class 53 One stem of any rose not eligible in classes 50-52.
